CESHIRE

- Cheshire was solely within the Archdeaconry of Chester after 1540
- Diocese of Chester after 1540 [prior to that **Lichfield** diocese]
- No peculiars
- Prerogative Court of York —archbishops jurisdiction
- Northern Province

- **A large number of Peculiars.**
